



Why is this important?


- UBC does its planning on the basis of Land Use Plans approved by the Province approximately every 10 years.
- The last Land Use Plan was approved in 2010 and led to the Neighbourhood Plans that dictate the developments we are seeing today.
- If we want to have a say in what future development in our neighbourhoods look like, we have to get involved NOW.
